Eligibility:

U.S. Citizenship or Permanent Residency

Current full-time enrollment in a U.S. college or university

Completion of basic course work in chemistry, biology and physics

Persons from groups underrepresented in science are strongly encouraged to apply

Sophomores and Juniors

Seniors who will be graduating in the next academic year are also eligible

Freshmen are not eligible to apply (even those with sophomore or higher standing)

Benefits:

Stipend of \$4,500

Housing in university dormitory or area apartments

Meal allowance

Students are expected to be on site full time during the program.
